Remembering Austria from Israel - Presentation of Interviews from the Austrian Heritage Collection

The Austrian Heritage Archive is a digital collection that documents the life stories of Austrian-Jews who immigrated to the US and Israel – the main centers or immigration for Austrian Jews. Since 1996 young Austrian volunteers of the association GEDENKDIENST made interviews at the Leo Baeck Institute in New York and since 2012 also in Israel. We will show excerpts of the interviews, speak with some of the former Austrian Jews and present the online database of the Austrian Heritage Collection.

The Nazi takeover of Austria in "Ephemeral" Films - Presentation of Austrian Private Movies around 1938

The audio-visual memory of the Nazi era and in particular of the year 1938 was considerably shaped by the official filmic and photographic images created by the Nazi propaganda machine. Archival collections such as the Austrian Film Museum's however hold unofficial images that supplement and sometimes contradict the official version of events. In our presentation, we show rare, often fragmentary and sometimes confusing "ephemeral" films: home movies, documentary reports, advertising and information films.
